

Reaching new heights

Lockton Court is the first high rise building to be completed as part of the regeneration plans that will see the complete transformation of the neighbourhood.

At Lockton Court 70 homes have been refurbished to improve the quality of accommodation for residents in Brunswick.

The refurbishments include all new kitchens and bathrooms, lifts, car parking, windows, balcony redesign and communal entry gates.

Some residents were able to stay in their home whilst refurbishment works were



carried out, however; some residents chose to move out completely to enable conversion work to be done.

Two of the residents who moved out completely for

over twelve months are Roy Hanley and Carol Duffy who moved out to enable their one-bedroom flat to be merged with the empty bedsit next door.

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Most of the bed-sits have been merged with one-bedroom flats next door, to create beautiful new two-bedroom apartments.

Roy said: "The transformation is amazing; if you had not seen the place before you really cannot imagine what it was like, and people who have, say they are staggered at the changes that have been made".

Carol added: "We love our

new home and it really is quite simply a 'new' home. It was so worth the wait and trouble of having to move out for a year. It's more than we could have ever dreamed of".

Work is due to start in October to build eleven much-needed council homes on land at Grosvenor Street/Lockton Close.

This land was identified for redevelopment in the very early stages of the Brunswick regeneration project.

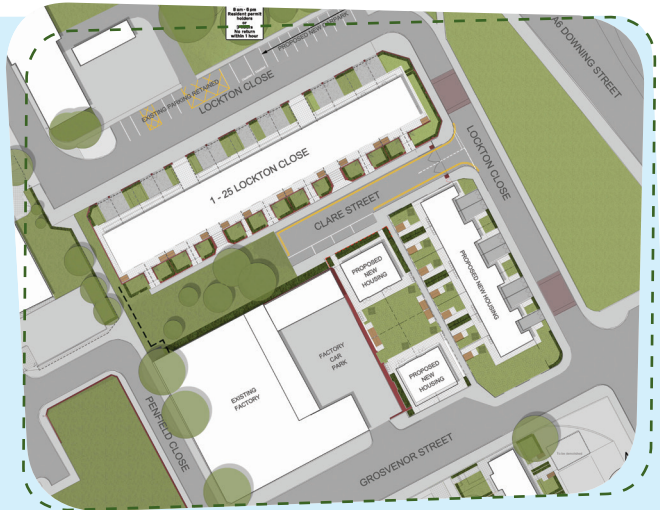
There was extensive consultation as the Brunswick regeneration plans were drawn up, including a number of public open days with further consultation with

residents before planning permission for the site was granted back in May 2013.

Eleven much-needed new homes for council tenants will be built on the land, replacing housing that will be demolished elsewhere in Brunswick and we have

already allocated these new homes to residents.

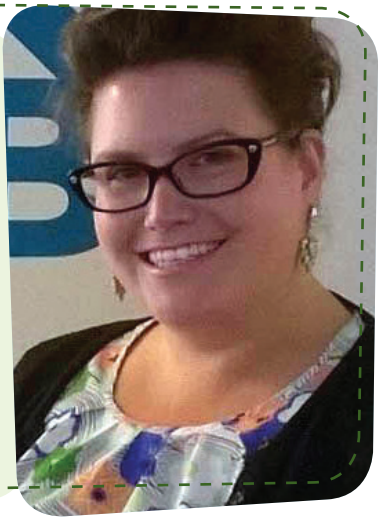

Reminder notice

During the regeneration works in Brunswick, including the high rise blocks, there will be increased pressure on parking areas, with some car parks being out of use whilst works are carried out.

We are encouraging all residents with a vehicle to ensure they have the correct permit, and to inform their visitors the area is restricted to a maximum of three hours parking in most areas, so may need to use a

parking meter for longer stays.

KAB revisit Brunswick

KAB's board members and senior staff travel abroad every two years, seeking inspiration and knowledge to help them tackle housing issues.

The Danish guests met tenants and S4B staff and were taken to see the extensive improvement works being carried out in the area.

Manager at S4B said: "Our Danish visitors were really interested in seeing all the regeneration and learning about all the different community projects happening in Brunswick."

KAB is a public organisation, owned by a number of housing providers. It manages approximately 50,000 leases and aims to create "a vibrant resident democracy", good housing and improve wellbeing.

Ardwick in days gone by

Born in Kelso on February 19, 1789, William Fairbairn was a Scotsman by birth. He came to Manchester in 1813, and became one of the most accomplished cotton mill engineers in the country.

In 1824 he went to Zurich, a very big step in those days, to erect two water mills. In 1830 he was elected a member of the Institute of Civil Engineers.

Fairbairn further developed shipbuilding, and constructed several vessels in sections at his Ancoats works. It was not, however, until the early

forties that he began the work for which he became most famous, when he was commissioned by the famous railway engineer George Stevenson, to construct bridges in Conwy and at the Menai Strait in North Wales.

From this time Fairbairn devoted his energies to his new branch of engineering, and erected bridges in all parts of the country.

In 1840 he bought a house in the Polygon, Stockport-road, Ardwick, and when he died on August 18, 1874, the funeral was attended by
