Manchester City Council (MCC) have replaced all black wheelie bins in Brunswick, with smaller grey ones.

Recycle more – less waste

Smaller bins means bigger savings, bigger savings means more to spend on services for YOU!

75% of your rubbish can be recycled. Please check what goes in each bin and don't cross contaminate.

If you need extra, or bigger, recycling bins, Manchester City Council will provide them for free.

You can only get a bigger grey bin if you have a large family or certain medical conditions and you're recycling everything you can.

Leaving extra rubbish beside a bin could land you a fine.

Which Bin?



Blue Bin

Paper items such as - newspapers and magazines, cardboard, gift wrap, food and soup cartons, flyers, leaflets and egg boxes.



Brown Bin

Plastic, tin can and tin foil items such as - Pop bottles, washing up liquid bottles, milk bottles, food and drinks cans, glass bottles and jars, tin foil and take-away trays.



Green Bin

Food and garden waste items such as- Raw and cooked meats, tea bags, cut flowers, bread products, fruit and veg peelings, dairy products and eggshells and plate scrapings.

All black wheelie bins in Brunswick have been replaced with smaller grey ones. Please recycle more to keep waste to a minimum

What is Fly-Tipping?

Fly-Tipping is the ILLEGAL dumping of rubbish

What damage can fly-tipping do?

- It causes pollution and contaminates land.
- It can have a negative effect on our health.
- It can endanger our wildlife.
- It can be unsightly, spoiling our communities and the quality of life for residents.
- It wrongly encourages others to dump more waste.

Who pays for fly-tipping?

We all do. Every year, it costs Council Tax Payers around £300,000 to clear waste dumped illegally on public land in Manchester.

Manchester City Council will investigate incidents, to catch and prosecute offenders. Anyone convicted of fly-tipping could be fined up to £50,000 and up to 1 year in prison

STOP IT!

What to do if you see someone fly-Tipping:

- Safety first – do not confront fly-tippers.
- Do not look for clues in the waste yourself - there may be harmful items hidden in it.
- Keep notes, which can be very valuable as evidence.
- Take photos if safe to do so.
