New homes and shops for Brunswick

S4B are pleased to announce work at the Polygon site started on Tuesday 7th June, seven months ahead of schedule, so residents will be seeing results much sooner than expected.

The new building on Polygon Street and Stockport Road, will include 18 new two-bedroom council flats, a new S4B neighbourhood office and other retail facilities.

The new properties for rent on Westman Drive and Addison Close are now complete, and the residents

have moved in. The 15 new properties for rent on Grosvenor Street are due for completion in December this year.

The next batch of new properties for sale, including 12 facing the park, are due for completion this month, when we will welcome 27 new

households into the area.

The next phase of new roadworks will start in 2017, and we will soon be starting work on car parking areas and rear boundaries on Lockton Close and will be consulting with those residents shortly.

And some more great news...work on Gartside Gardens is almost finished and the park will be ready for summer 2016.

The latest on refurbishment...

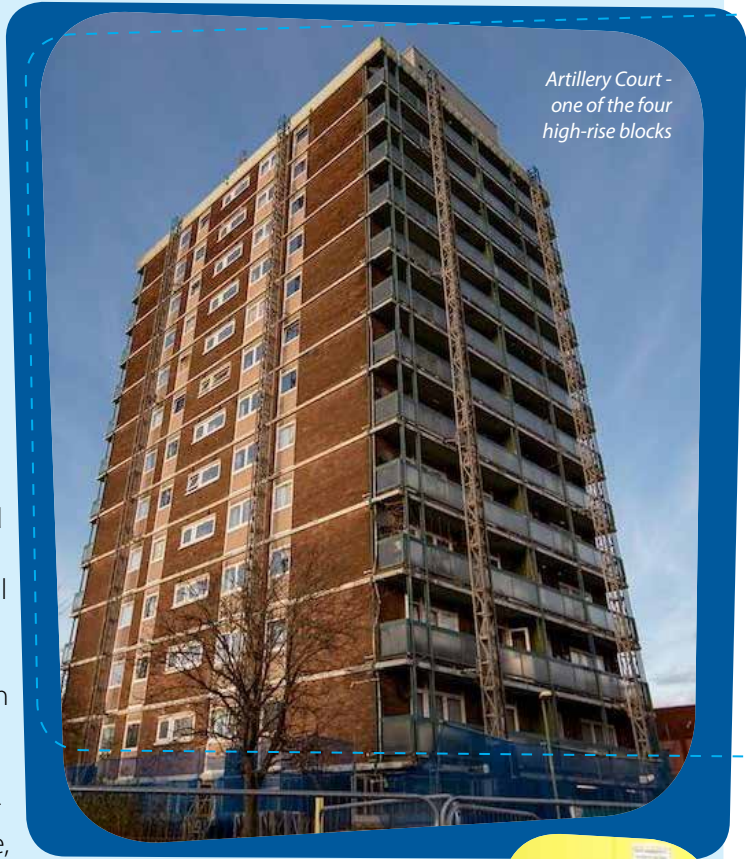

Want to grow your own?

Sow the city, visited the Meanwhile Allotment at the S4B Housing office in April, to provide training and education on growing your own fruit and veg.

Members of Chorlton-on-Medlock Allotment Society (COMAS), residents of Brunswick, and visitors from

other areas of Manchester came along to the session specifically aimed at people living in urban areas.

COMAS have also been busy helping Medlock Primary School to plant trees and bushes around the school and set up a bird box painting session for the children.

At the Meanwhile Allotment this year's crop is coming along nicely with both fruit and vegetables.

Happy 40th EYC

It's 40 years since Elizabeth Yarwood Court was built on the 17th April 1976, so to mark the occasion a party was organised by S4B.



S4B Scheme Manager, Donna Shaw provided the catering - there was a DJ, complete with sing-a-long, karaoke and of course a birthday cake!

When it was constructed, the property was named after Dame Elizabeth Yarwood (nee Gaskell), born on 25 November 1900 and who died on 31 December 1989.

She served for over thirty-five years as a councillor with Manchester City Council, was Lord Mayor of Manchester (1967-68) and in 1969, was appointed DBE (Dame Commander of the British Empire) in recognition of her extensive community work.
