

Development Completion in Brunswick

We are fast approaching the end of the development stage of the 25-year regeneration project of the Brunswick neighbourhood.

In less than a decade the neighbourhood has been transformed with the refurbishment of more than 650 council homes, including completely transforming its four iconic high-rise blocks.

250 households were rehomed to allow for demolition, making way for new homes to be built and 500 new properties have been constructed for sale and rent, helping to deliver Manchester's residential growth strategy, providing much-needed quality housing in the city. An all-new housing office has been developed with 18 apartments and retail units and 60-apartment purpose-built scheme for the over 55s, complete with on-site amenities such as salon, age friendly care facilities, bistro, and public area for use by the community was recently constructed.

FIRE SAFETY UPDATE

In January 2023, new Government fire regulations came into force. Since then we have been working hard to refresh and circulate our literature to help keep you as safe as possible.

New fire notices are displayed in all communal areas and fire safety packs distributed to all residents tailored to your property type.

Please be aware: If you have an electric e-bike or scooter at your property. E-bikes and E-scooters powered by Lithium-ion batteries are becoming increasingly popular and are responsible for a rising number of fires within homes. In the space of two years, the number of fires linked to this kind of technology has risen by more than 400%.

It is essential that E-bikes, E-scooters and any other devices powered by Lithium-ion batteries are bought, stored, maintained, used and disposed of responsibly, to protect people and property. Find out more here.

New sprinkler systems will be installed to the high-rise blocks, one at a time starting later this year.

Senior housing officials from all over the country will come together to experience the tour to learn all about the PFI, how it started and how things have progressed to the end of the building phase of works.

Starting from the main event at Manchester Central, delegates will walk down to the neighbourhood via Oxford Road to start the tour from the bottom of Grosvenor Street.

For those who choose to, there will be time to take in the views from the top of the high-rise Lamport Court to give a true flavour of the location and proximity of the area.

Attendees will then take in the sights of the neighbourhood from the ground, such as the park and play areas, new properties for sale and rent, refurbishments and reversed properties before the final stop, Brunswick Village where there will be chance to take in

some refreshments and discuss what they have seen before heading back to the main event for the evening.

Brunswick Tenants and Resident Association, Mike from Manchester Young Community Champions and members of the Allotment society will be on hand to offer an insight to the community aspect of the tour.

STOP FLUSHING WET WIPES DOWN THE TOILET

Wet wipes cause the drains to block and will lead to them backing up and flooding.

Please place all wet wipes in the bin not the toilet. This includes ALL wipes; baby wipes, cosmetic face wipes plus floor and surface wipes.

Products like wipes and nappies don't just disappear down the u-bend and dissolve - they clump together and cause havoc in the sewers.

All-too-often we see the misery caused to people when blocked sewers have caused their homes and gardens to flood.

Please help prevent this from happening. Your co-operation is appreciated.

S4B hold information on dates of birth, national insurance numbers, emails addresses and phone numbers.

All this information is saved and stored securely and never shared. To ensure verification of callers in the coming months, you will see the introduction of a verification process where information is asked on all calls. This is to prevent impersonation or people acting on behalf of a resident without authority from the resident.

All personal information is stored securely on the Orchard Housing Management System and under the laws of Data Protection and are only ever shared to support your tenancy or as required by law.
