Check your flat entrance door is fire safe.



It's as easy as 1-2-3



Check you have a self-closing device. The door should close firmly onto the latch without sticking to the floor or the frame.



Check fire strips (usually a plastic strip with a fuzzy brush) are around the top and sides of the door or frame. Check they're intact with no signs of damage.



Check your door fully shuts into the frame and has no damage or holes. Open it six inches and make sure it can fully self-close.

Communal areas.

- You must keep communal areas clear and free from all obstructions that will impact on the occupants ability to safely evacuate your building
- No items must be left in the communal area which would prevent the fire service from assessing your building
- The stairways are escape routes, and must be kept completely clear
- Fire doors must be kept closed and not propped open
- We maintain communal areas undertaking regular inspections to ensure they remain safe
- Any items found in communal areas will be considered a Fire Hazard and will be removed and disposed of
