The Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) continue to roll out Managed Migration to Universal Credit for claimants in receipt of Tax Credits, Income Support and Housing Benefits.

Managed Migration is the final phase of the rollout of Universal Credit, when the DWP are contacting those who are still claiming legacy (Old style) benefits to notify them that those benefits will be ending and inviting them to claim Universal Credit instead.

The DWP send a Migration Notice informing those on legacy benefits that the benefits will be ending on their Deadline Day and if they wish to continue to receive financial support, then it will explain what needs to be done to claim Universal Credit - the move is not automatic, so it is important if you receive this notice you don't ignore the letter.

Claimants of other benefits, including Income Related Employment and Support Allowance are due to receive their Migration Notices later this year.

As always, contact the S4B Money Advice team for advice and support and we will guide you through the process. Or, if you're struggling to make ends meet or just need a little bit of support, the Money Advice and Support Team are here on hand to offer help and sign post you in the right direction.

S4B Tenant Satisfaction Measures

The survey was undertaken by Onward Homes' S4B Housing Management Team with technical support being provided by Onward Homes' Analytics and Insight Team.



It is important to note that this new survey takes a much broader view of all services and includes repairs as well as review of customer opinion of the neighbourhood services provided by S4B in Brunswick. Comparison with previous years will not be possible on many areas due to the changed format and audience.

Four Key areas

Overall Satisfaction

2023 the score was **86.27%** against a target of 83% which is **3.27%** above target.

In 2022 the figure was **89.43%** and in 2020 it was **86.3%**.

This is a contractual measure for S4B.

Neighbourhood Management

Tenants were asked how S4B managed the neighbourhood and if S4B makes a positive contribution to the area.

The survey showed **74.58%** of customers were very or fairly satisfied S4B's neighbourhood management service.

Tenant Involvement Opportunities

Tenant involvement in S4B forms a contractual key performance indicator. Satisfaction for opportunities available for resident involvement in Brunswick was 91.57% against a KPI target of 70% which is 21.57% above target. In 2022 this was 95.15% and in 2020

this was **91.3%** across all tenders.

Communal Area Management

Tenant satisfaction showed that **79.33%** of residents felt communal areas are clean and well maintained, demonstrating a very high standard of communal area management and tenant perception of this.

More trees for Brunswick

Work is being carried out to complete the street tree planting programme and completion of the site compound area on Plymouth View / Upper Brunswick Street.

There will be 57 additional street trees being planted in grassed verges and green spaces to add to the tree cover in Brunswick and bring environmental benefits. The locations are listed on the website and remaining garden trees will follow separately

Works to the site compound off Plymouth View include a footpath through the area with grass either side of the path. There will be wildflower seeding and a small number of trees to the remaining area.

On the completion of these works the car park will be secured with the vehicle gate being made live shortly after. If you have any concerns or queries, please do not hesitate to contact the S4B Housing Office on **0300 555 0128**.

Care for Existing Trees

S4B planted trees in gardens and around the neighbourhood as part of the regeneration programme, and the time has arrived for all stakes and straps to be removed from these threes that are now maturing.

S4B is removing those straps in the public spaces but residents with trees in their own front or back garden need to remove these.

So, if you have a garden at your property, please remove any straps on the trees to help the trees grow and prevent scarring the tree trunk.

Trees are typically staked to provide additional support until the tree has established a root system strong enough to

support it. These stakes are only intended as a temporary aid so it's important to remove them once a tree has enough strength in its main trunk.

Employment and Training Update

Twelve people were successfully recruited to train to work in the care sector.

We had a fantastic response to the advert for the Open Day for the training course, with more than 50 people in attendance at the S4B Housing Office and many phone calls of interest.

They were all referred to Smartworks, where they were given assistance with their CV's, interviewing skills and clothing in preparation for the big day.

To date there have been seven offers of employment, five with a potential to start work in Wythenshawe and two here in Brunswick.

We'll stay in touch with them to see how they get on so we can update you further on their progress.

Window safety

Window restrictors are devices that are installed on windows to keep them from opening too far.



These should be in place in high rise homes and this can help prevent falls and accidents, especially for young children.

Please do not tamper or remove window restrictors, they are in place for your safety. If you have any concerns or any missing restrictors, please contact S4B on 0300 555 0128.
